Had CAP collaborated with us on the information, we would surely have raided the premises.</div><div align="justify">For CAP's information, we do not analyse belacan alone but thousands of other products in ensuring safe food is sold to the public. There are thousands of premises in this country selling food to the public and our officers might have missed the shop that CAP took samples from.

In 2005, out of 320 samples of belacan, we found that five samples (1.56 per cent) contained Rhodamine B. We confiscated 870kg of the product. Legal action was also instituted.

br />Last year, 75 samples were tested and only six samples (8.0 per cent) contravened regulations. So far this year (up to April), 54 samples have been taken; only four samples (7.41 per cent) were found to contain Rhodamine B.
