Worried with the rising number of cases, the ministry said for the past two years, it had identified several products which had been adulterated. </div>
They involved 17 products which were mostly for men's health; weight loss (six); cough medicine (five) and joint pain (four).

 lngredients that had been identified in the adulterated products were sildenafil and tadalafil, which were commonly prescribed for erectile dysfunction, sibutramine which is used for weight reduction and steroids, the ministry said in a statement.
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The ministry would not hesitate to take stern action against those who failed to comply with the standards and requirements, including cancelling the product registration and instructing a total recall of the adulterated product from the market.
